Water Project Update

Hello friends!

I have been working with D & R Tank, the folks who will not only build and place our new tank, but will also construct the new foundation for the tank. There is need for some prelimary site work to be done prior to the new foundation being poured and I have asked D & R Tank to provide us with a quote for that work. The engineer from D & R Tank has reviewed the foundation design as provided by Geomat as requested by Dan Flack, our current engineer. The D & R Tank engineer will be providing a new design for the foundation in order that I can submit that design to the NM Environment Department. The new design may save considerable money but is subject to what the NM Env allows.

The project funds are as follows: Total Donations: \$167,382, Expenses: \$62,951 and the balance is \$104,421. What we still need to pay: Balance to D & R Tank for the tank itself: \$44,173, Quote from D & R Tank for the foundation: \$62,163.60. Preliminary site work: Estimated at \$20,000. Remainder needed to complete tank project is estimated to be \$21,916.

As soon as the new design from D & R Tank is available, I will submit it to NM Env Department for their review.

Thanks to everyone who has donated to this very needed project. Please help us continue to meet the goal.

Recently, Sherman Moeller and a group of paleontologists came to visit the Mission and brought in donations of a couch, dishwasher, dryer, assorted groceries and several dozen new New Balance shoes to the delight of both the students and the staff.

Pastor Mark Phillips, pastor of Pinion Hills and its neighboring churches including La Vida Mission SDA Church, drives to the Mission every Tuesday to do worship/chapel for our students and staff and to teach our high school students basic auto mechanics. But most of the time he also comes with a truck load of clothes, household items, cleaning supplies and food from our brothers and sisters in Pinion Hills Church and Aztec Churches which helps not only our dorms and cafeteria, but also our Community Services and Dorcas.

We found another partner in Ministry in Bimbo Bakeries. They have donated huge amount of breads and pastries that's more than enough to supply our cafeteria, dorms,

staff houses, and church needs and so we're able to share it with our outreach programs. This weekend, we're able to distribute to all the Mission campus residents, cafeteria, dorms, church, and to the community such as the chapter house, senior center, church guests and community neighbors a total of 120 crates of assorted bread from wheat and white loaf breads, hotdog and hamburger buns, English muffins and bagels, pizza crust and donuts and all kinds of boxed pastries.

Surely, God's promise of blessings continue to shower upon La Vida Mission in all forms and from all sources. Thank you Lord. - Dorie Panganiban

can master it if they keep trying. What a good lesson for them and for all of us!








Ms. Claire's Class
