We need help from our partners in mission today. As many of you know, all of our funding comes from your donations. We no longer receive any funds from the conference because they are no longer allowed to give to independent, supporting ministries. This withdrawl of support has caused financial difficulties for us as we have been increasing our outreach after the pandemic restrictions have been slowly lifted.

We know that many of you have supported us for years and we thank you for your generous support in our past, present and future. You have always come through when we had a need. We also know that inflation has created financial difficulties for many of you as well. We are not, and never would, ask you to deprive yourself or your local church of much needed funds in order to send money to us. We do ask you to pray that God will open hearts and doors so that our mission and our school can be funded and our ministry here can continue.

For the past several months our income has not kept up with our expenses. We have had some unusually high expenses such as bed bugs in the dorms, broken tractors, broken vehicles (we have no mechanic now), new internet technology, etc. We are now using up our reserve funds and need about \$30,000 to catch up. This does not include the expense of the water tank project (see article below).

Water Project Update

Last month I was able to report that our old unused tank was moved to make way for our new tank. On May 10th, the crew came to take core soil samples from the area where our new tank will be installed. I will receive a report on the samples sometime

this coming week. Once the report is satisfactory, our engineer will design and get the concrete foundation plan approved from the state of NM, Then the foundation can be poured. The next step will be to install the new tank.

I am happy and we are blessed to report the current financial status of the project to you. Our total income is \$131,367; total expenses to date are \$45,841.35 which leaves us a balance of \$85.525.65. We will still need at least an additional \$30,000 for all the costs to be covered for the project, which is less than our original estimate.

Thank you all for your kind and generous giving to this vital project. I am certain we will finish the work and all will be benefited as we continue to serve our friends and neighbors. God bless each of you!

Mother's Day Event Health Outreach




On Friday, May 19th, we were offered another opportunity to do a Health Outreach to the Navajo community when we received an invitation from Whiterock Chapter on the Navajo Nation, to run a booth in Nutrition and Exercise. They requested us also to show to the event participants how to make nutritious smoothies which are a far better alternative to the soda that people in the area are more used to drinking and how to do simple exercises that will suit the needs of mothers and the elders.

My mom (Ms. Dorie) and I ran the nutrition booth and we prepared nachos with vegan cheese in addition to the smoothies which are equally an event favorite. It's so exciting to see the people really enjoying our nutritious food samples. One grandpa commented, "this is my first time to drink smoothies, but it's good". A mother who was

eating the vegan nachos that we made said, "you won't tell the difference with cheese, it's really good". A little boy chose the smoothies over the cake served at the event which I feel was cool. In the exercise booth, my husband, VJ, showed the people and had them follow him while doing some easy movements and light to moderate exercises that catered to their age and health condition. Maintenance Assistant Position Open

La Vida Mission is seeking to hire a qualified, Christ-centered Maintenance Assistant effective immediately. This position is full-time with a stipend, housing, utilities, food benefits and a request for a minimum of a three year commitment to the right person with the qualifications and experience. Duties include helping the maintenance director complete maintenance requests from campus personnel. Upkeep and repair of campus facilities, which include carpentry, plumbing, electrical, drywall, minor appliance repair, basic equipment maintenance, and other general maintenance items. Candidates must be a team player with a willingness to learn, be self-motivated, aware of his/her surroundings and able to exercise common sense. This position is open until filled. LVM is a dedicated ministry to its surrounding community with an outreach department, church & school which the entire staff is a part of by being a team player. As in many other SDA boarding schools, employees live in on-campus housing. The average student population at LVM is between 18 to 25 students.

Experience: Candidates must be at least 21 years old and have a good driving record. Preference will be given to candidates that have previous experience in general maintenance and vehicle repair/maintenance. Proficiency in construction, plumbing is a plus. A bonus opportunity to the right person will be free schooling and training to become a level 1, 2 or 3 water operator. An experience that can be of good use here and in future employment opportunities.
